## Guided Programs

Choose three guided programs to build your day at O'Keefe Ranch. The students will be split into groups and rotate through programs, with time for lunch.

O'Keefe Mansion Jour - Grades 2, 3, 4, 5

Take a tour of the O'Keefe Mansion and learn about and about the family who lived onsite for 110 years. about how the Ranch was first established,

Yeneral. Store - Yrades 2, 3, 4, 5
Take a tour of the General Store and learn about the early post office, what families would buy at a store, and household tools of the 19th century. Teachers have the option of allowing students to buy candy at the end of their tour.

Schubert House Pioneers — Grades 3, 4, 5
Learn all about the Schubert Family, immigrants to Canada who travelled overland from Winnipeg to British Columbia in the 1860s. Decide as a group what belongings, tools, furnishings and food would take with you on such a journey, and what you would have to leave behind.

First Nations Hunters and Gatherers — Grades 2, 3

Sit outside with us on traditional Syilk land, while you touch and see traditional materials used by the First Nations. Think about the types of problems you might encounter living in untamed land, and how you would use materials to overcome those problems and build tools. Listen to a traditional Okanagan story or two while you're here.

First Contact Jrading Game — Grades 3, 4, 5 Split into two teams and take turns trading items to ensure that you can survive the winter. . Will you get everything you need?

ictorian Schoolhouse — Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 leet at the Balmoral schoolhouse door and be introduced to your Victorian schoolm She will guide you through an authentic school lesson where you will write on a real slate and learn your 3 Rs. Don't be late!



## Self-Guided Programs

Choose one self-guided program to finish building your day at O'Keefe Ranch. The students will be split into groups and rotate through programs, with time for lunch.

St. Anne's Cemetery — Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 (self-guided)

Take a stroll through the St. Anne's Church cemetery and look around at the headstones and think about: who is the youngest person here? Which grave is the fanciest? Which is the plainest? How does this tell us how we remember historical figures? Students can make a rubbing on a headstone of their choice.

Old-Jashioned James — Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 (self-guided)
Get some energy out by playing old fashioned games, including examples of both

European and First Nations pastimes.

Whats-9t? —  $Grades\ 2$ , 3, 4, 5 (self-quided) What is it? What was it used for? Take a look at a selection of mysterious museum items, and

tell us what these items were used for in the past.

Scavenger Hunt — Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 (self-guided)
Explore the entire Ranch on foot while looking for items on our famous scavenger hunt list. Can you find them all?

General Store Scavenger Hunt – Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 (self-guided)
Explore the rtifacts in the General Store by finding one item for every letter in the letter in the alphabet. Bet you've never heard of a quokka before
